

From the President Tatsuya Norii, MD, FACEP

Hello New Mexico ACEP members,

As I promised in the last issue, we used teleconference technology at the quarterly meeting on June 29th. About 20 members attended the session in person, and two joined the meeting remotely. Because our state is so geographically large and we often work evening or night shifts, it can be difficult for us to participate in state-wide meetings. We will continue working toward making our regular meetings accessible.

Our next quarterly meeting will be held on September 26th. Similar to last year, we will join the annual meeting of the New Mexico Hospital Association (NMHA) at Embassy Suites, Albuquerque. We will have our own track at the meeting with topics focused on emergency medicine. My First Month of PGY2 Ralph Bauer, MD PGY-2, Department of Emergency Medicine University of New Mexico EMS rolls the patient to a bed. It's apparent she needs to stay in the resuscitation area: diaphoretic, tachypneic, tachycardic, hypoxic on a non-rebreather, a borderline blood pressure, and a history of severe COPD. The patient is transferred to a bed as the nurse, respiratory therapist, and techs swarm. They connect beeping monitors, establish IV access, and affix oxygen devices. All eyes turn to me: "What do you want to do?"

An all too common question but asked with even more urgency and impatience since starting PGY2. Lately even taking a second to think feels too long. The attending is occupied. I'm in charge. A slight pang of anxiety shoots through me. I know what to do, but my recent escalation of responsibility has left me more cautious and unsure. I take a breath and rattle off orders: nebs, BiPAP, fluids, antibiotics, steroids, labs, imaging, EKG. The staff seem to approve. I run through my plan for potential intubation and retreat to my computer for a chart biopsy. My eyes never leave the vitals on the monitor. The numbers slowly improve. I'm relieved the situation has passed without harm done to the patient or my standing in the ED hierarchy. As a new senior resident, I constantly feel the pressure of proving my worth to the attendings and ED staff. Earning their trust is essential and standards are understandably high. <u>READ MORE</u>.

Finally! An X-Waiver Course Designed for EM Docs, by EM Docs! High Quality, High Value Course Coming to a Hospital Near You!

Last fall, National ACEP commissioned a group of national EM experts in treatment of opioid addiction in collaboration with the American Academy of Addiction Psychiatry (AAAP) to develop an X-waiver course specifically for EM docs. The course is much more case based than the traditional course, and the learning modules have been completely revised to target the needs of EM docs, with an emphasis on pain management, acute withdrawal management, and ED buprenorphine initiation. This project was co-chaired by our own Eric Ketcham, MD, MBA, FACEP, FASAM, FACHE and Kate Hawk, MD, MS, FACEP of Yale University.

The course will be taught at ACEP20 in Denver, AAEM SA 2020 in Phoenix, at state and regional ACEP and other EM conferences, and at hospitals around the USA.

In New Mexico, we will begin by running new EM focused X-waiver course at Presbyterian hospitals in August, and by December at UNM facilities as well. <u>Click</u> <u>here</u> for a list of courses offered by Presbyterian through December and to review the funding and credit statements.

While most "X Waiver" training courses are developed for and led by psychiatrists and officebased addiction specialists, **this recently approved version of the course was written by a team of EM docs, specifically for EM Docs**. The MAT-EM course minimizes lecture in favor of case-based discussion and participants will emerge from the course not only credentialed to register for their DATA 2000 (X) waiver but prepared to manage all aspects of emergency care of OUD patients.
